

<b>Attendance</b>	<p>Attendance of your child is now completed in Arbor not ClassCharts. We are aware that sometimes these systems do not communicate fully and if your child is part of a non-subject activity that ClassCharts does not show this correctly, particularly around music. When we move fully over to Arbor this will not be the case but we ask that you are patient in the interim. There is no need to contact our attendance team if you find that ClassCharts is reporting absence and you know they have music.</p> <p>Thank you. Attendance Team</p>
<b>Equipment</b>	<p>Bringing all of the correct equipment to school each day is a crucial foundation to your child's educational success. We want to encourage students to take responsibility for their stationary which is why bringing the correct equipment for learning is one of our new school rules.</p> <p>If your child arrives at school without their pencil case they can collect a pen, pencil and ruler from the Cresswell Doors from 8.00am until the start of school without any sanction. As long as they look after this equipment throughout the day they will not be given any behaviour points for equipment. If you notice that your child is receiving behaviour points for lack of equipment please support them with their organisation and remind them to take up this offer on the Cresswell doors.</p> <p>We ask all students to bring the following equipment to school:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● A pencil case</li> <li>● At least 2 black or blue pens</li> <li>● A pencil</li> <li>● A sharpener</li> <li>● A rubber</li> <li>● A ruler</li> <li>● A scientific calculator</li> <li>● A reading book</li> </ul>

Many thanks.</p> <p><b>Educake for children with SEND</b>  <b>Improving the display:</b> You can find some additional information for supporting your child <a href="#">here</a>. The article is directed at teachers, but really useful for parents and carers supporting their child too.  <b>Spelling:</b> It may be useful for you to know that when a student types a response, Educake is programmed to accept 2 incorrect characters. If your child has received 'incorrect' but they are sure the answer is right, they can click on the purple question mark and their response goes to their teacher to check. Teachers can manually over-ride to accept correct answers that are spelt incorrectly.  <b>Duration:</b> Educake quizzes are intended to take up to 30 minutes for children in year 7 and year 8. If your child has spent 30min on their homework and has still not finished, please ask them to leave the remainder of the questions. The quiz will show as incomplete on our records, but we can check how long a student has spent working through it.</p>

<p><b>Y11 Art, 3D, Graphics and Textiles Exams</b></p>	<p>Students are now half way through their preparation time and have just 6 weeks to go before their timed sessions. Your child will have received feedback from their teacher about how to make progress, please ask them to share this with you, and take time to look at the work that they have been doing. It always helps our art students if they have to talk about and explain their work to others. Now that the second set of mocks are over, half term is a great time to catch up on any missing development work, take photos and visit appropriate exhibitions. The timed sessions (in exam conditions) are from the 28th April to the 1st May and then it is all over for them.</p>									

 <p><b>We are an 'Operation Encompass' school</b></p>	<p>Through Operation Encompass the police will share information with our school about <b>all</b> police-attended domestic abuse incidents which involve any of our learners or who are related to either of the adults involved in the incident.</p> <p>Children are recognised as victims of domestic abuse in their own right even if they are witnesses rather than victims of abuse (Domestic Abuse Act, 2021) As such, there is a legislative requirement for police forces to share information with educational settings through Operation Encompass.</p> <p>The notification will inform the Designated Safeguarding Lead (Mia Helmich) about the context of the incident, who was involved and where possible, will include the Voice of the Child. The Operation Encompass notification is stored in line with all other confidential safeguarding and child protection information. This information is then shared only on a 'need to know basis' and in the best interest of the child or children affected.</p> <p>We have a warm and experienced Pastoral Team at BCCS, who can support young people on a day-to-day basis and particularly following an Operation Encompass notification.</p>

<p><b>Safeguarding E-safety</b></p>	<p><b>Has your child worked with CAMHS?</b></p> <p>Police in Essex have released some disturbing details of harmful social media accounts targeting children that have been involved with CAMHS and CAMHS inpatient wards. Two young adults have been found to be involved in running TikTok accounts with thousands of followers that encourage self harm.</p> <p><b>I would advise all parents/carers to closely monitor their child's social media (followers and following) and consider any contact that vulnerable children may have with digital communities as they are often unregulated and can be problematic or even dangerous.</b></p>
<p><b>Supporting a Healthy Learning Environment</b></p>	<p>We want our students to have the best possible environment for learning. To help with this, please remember that chewing gum and fizzy/energy drinks are not permitted on site.</p> <p>Gum causes lasting damage to our school carpets, and high-sugar drinks can make it difficult for students to stay focused in class. We appreciate your support in encouraging water or healthy alternatives to keep our school clean and our students ready to learn.</p>

<p><b>Science Educake homework</b></p>	<p>Many thanks to parents and carers for your continued support in helping students establish a consistent routine of revisiting prior learning in Science.</p> <p>Students in Years 7–11 are set a weekly Educake quiz, which must be completed by <b>9:00am each Monday</b>. Unless otherwise stated in a student's SEN passport, a detention will be issued if this deadline is missed.</p> <p>Students who miss the deadline might not see their Science teacher on a Monday to be informed of the detention. Therefore, resulting detentions will be scheduled for the following day. This slight adjustment to the usual same-day detention policy ensures students can continue to follow the school's no-phones policy and have the opportunity to check ClassCharts notifications after school on Monday evenings, reducing the risk of missing detentions.</p> <p>We appreciate your ongoing support in reinforcing these expectations at home.</p>

The purpose of these revision quizzes is to revisit previous content so that students have the opportunity to practise their retrieval skills to aid retention of knowledge in the longer term.</p> <p>Students who miss this deadline will automatically be issued a detention for Tuesday, so please take a minute to email your child's Science teacher if they have been unable to complete the homework for legitimate reasons.</p> <p><b>For students with SEND:</b></p> <p><b>Duration:</b> Students in years 7 and 8 should spend no more than 30min on the task, even if that means they haven't tried all questions. Their teachers can see how long they have spent actively engaging with the quiz - 30min is enough.</p> <p><b>Improving the display:</b> You can find additional support <a href="#">here</a>. Although written for teachers, it is also useful for parents and carers.</p> <p><b>Spelling:</b> Please note that Educake allows up to two incorrect characters in typed answers. If a student believes their answer is correct, they can click the purple question mark for teacher review.</p> <p>Many thanks for your support.</p>

## Kinship Care

Are you a kinship carer?

Kinship carers are friends or family who step in to raise a child when their parents may not be able to. This may be temporary or long term. You might be a grandparent whose grandchild has come to live with you or perhaps you are taking care of a younger sibling or niece. There are more than 141,000 children living in kinship care in England and Wales (source: Kinship care charity) and so you are certainly not alone.

If you are a kinship carer, please let us know. This will help us to better support you and your child, and we will be able to signpost you to further help and advice. We will handle any information shared sensitively.

The Kinship care charity offer a wide variety of support for kinship carers including online workshops on a range of relevant topics and local coffee mornings.
