Equipment	Bringing all of the correct equipment to school each day is a crucial foundation to your child's educational success. We want to encourage students to take responsibility for their stationery which is why bringing the correct equipment for learning is one of our new school rules. If your child arrives at school without their pencil case they can collect a pen, pencil and ruler from the Cresswell Doors from 8.00am until the start of school without any sanction. As long as they look after this equipment throughout the day they will not be given any behaviour points for equipment. If you notice that your child is receiving behaviour points for lack of equipment please support them with their organisation and remind them to take up this offer on the Cresswell doors. We ask all students to bring the following equipment to school: • A pencil case • At least 2 black or blue pens • A pencil • A sharpener • A rubber • A ruler • A scientific calculator • A reading book
Important Medical information requested	In the final week of last academic year all parents and carers were sent an email asking for updated medical information in relation to severe allergic reactions/anaphylaxis - in line with Benedict's Law. This is a reminder to submit an allergy plan to school if your child suffers from a life threatening allergy and/or they carry an auto injector such as an EpiPen. The letter is linked here for your convenience and has been emailed to all new starters in Years 7 and 8. Please return allergy forms at your earliest convenience. Additionally, we remind you, it is safest not to allow your child to bring nut products to school.

Educake for children with SEND Improving the display: You can find some additional information for supporting your child here. The article is directed at teachers, but really useful for parents and carers supporting their child too. Spelling: It may be useful for you to know that when a student types a response, Educake is programmed to accept 2 incorrect characters. If your child has received 'incorrect' but they are sure the answer is right, they can click on the purple question mark and their response goes to their teacher to check. Teachers can manually over-ride to accept correct answers that are spelt incorrectly. Duration: Educake quizzes are intended to take up to 30 minutes for children in year 7 and year 8. If your child has spent 30min on their homework and has still not finished, please ask them to leave the remainder of the questions. The quiz will show as incomplete on our records, but we can check how long a student has spent working through it.

Music

Music	A reminder that students need to check their music lesson timetables at home before coming to school. It is their responsibility to know when they have a lesson. We have had an increasing number of students coming to the office to ask, some more frequently than others. All instruments must be kept in the instrument storage by the practice rooms on the top floor of the rectory. There have been an increasing number of instruments being left in the Cresswell lobby. This looks very unsightly, can be a trip hazard and it is not a secure location. School is not responsible for instruments that are left here. If the instrument cupboard is full there are shelves on the upper floors of the Cresswell by the theatre.
PE Curriculum Update	There has been a significant amount of change in our PE curriculum offer for this year. • Students in KS3 will be departing during tutor time for Failand PE lessons directly from their morning line up (7s + 8s). This will allow us an extended PE lesson per week. • Students will be learning about and through a range of sports. Each student will learn through the same types of sports (such as Invasion games) but not necessarily the exact same sport. This is due to logistics of space at Failand and factoring in extra-curricular activities within Bristol available to our students. • For all students, our aim is to ensure students have the confidence, motivation, knowledge and skills to be physically active beyond school. We have designed our curriculum offer around this aim. • In KS3, we are focusing on the holistic development of students within PE and physical activity by developing their physical skills within a sport, their knowledge and understanding within a sport/activity and developing opportunities to develop their character and social skills. This is in line with the 'Physical Literacy' model of PE delivery and is a renewed focus within lessons. • In KS4, students have selected a pathway to follow based on how they value, enjoy and are motivated to engage in physical activity. These pathways will allow students to learn and engage in PE and physical activity with students who have a similar mindset to themselves enabling greater participation and progress. • In KS4, we continue to use Kingsdown Leisure Centre as an additional provision to widen the curriculum offer. Students will have at least one term in the year where they will access Kingsdown. This involves students walking to the Leisure Centre

	with staff supervision.
PE Kit to be worn on PE days	Students will wear their PE kit + lanyards to school on their PE day. They will remain in their kit after their PE lessons. Mondays = Year 10; Tuesdays = Year 7; Wednesdays = Year 8; Thursdays = Year 9; Fridays = Year 11 and Sixth Form This means students can come to school in kit and stay in PE kit all day if they want to. If they would prefer to wear your uniform and change at Failand, that is fine. The PE kit expectations: ○ BCCS PE top (Polo or Rugby) and BCCS all weather top as required. ○ Plain black joggers, leggings, skort or shorts. ○ Sports trainers/school shoes. ○ Lanyard ○ Sport specific equipment as required (boots, gum shield, shin pads etc.) ○ Long hair is tied back and all jewellery is removed/taped. The PE team needs your support to make this work and to maximise lesson time. ● Students must wear the correct PE kit for the full day. ● Students must also wear their lanyards throughout the day. ● If it is a rainy day, students must either bring an extra pair of black shorts/leggings/tracksuit bottoms or their uniform to change into after the lesson and wear their all weather tops! ● If it is a cold day, we encourage students to wear additional layers underneath their BCCS PE top, bring gloves, hat etc as appropriate for participating in PE. ● We will give students time to change after the lesson before we head back to school on cold/wet days.
